Readers Anonymous Book Club Wednesday, Oct. 20 at 6:30 PM Location to be announced


For the October 20 meeting of Readers Anonymous, the book club for readers in their 20s and 30s will discuss the novel *The Historian* by Elizabeth Kostova.



Public Library**



Columbia County-based author **Jeff Nania**, will introduce his latest book, *Bough Cutter* at the Baraboo Civic Center, Room 12/14. This new book is the third installment in Nania's Northern Lakes Mystery series,



preceded by *Figure Eight* (2018) and *Spider Lake* (2020). The books follow John Cabrelli, retired law enforcement officer, seeking to build a new life for himself on a tranquil Northern lake. But he finds his law enforcement skills useful when he is called upon to help solve crimes and mysteries in the quiet Northwoods paradise.

Nania is an award-winning mystery writer with a background in wetland restoration, conservation education, and law enforcement. After his presentation, he will sign copies of his books, available for purchase from a Village Booksmith representative at the event.
