Doug Tallamy demystifies the main player in Aldo Leopold's "Good Oak" essay in *A Sand County Almanac* in his new book, *The Nature of Oaks*. Join Doug on November 10th at 7 PM CST to explore the importance of oaks in complex ecosystems and understand how YOU can contribute to their health in your natural communities." 


Readers Anonymous Book Club
