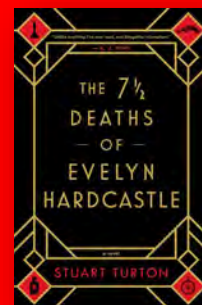

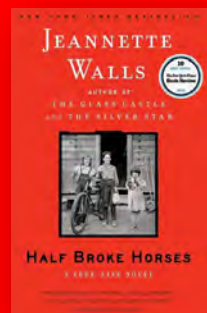

Why Trees Matter Thursday, Sept. 30 at 6:30 PM Baraboo Civic Center, Rm. 12/14

Mike Hardy, Baraboo Parks, Recreation, and Forestry Director, will tell about the importance of trees to the City of Baraboo during this presentation at the Baraboo Civic Center. The City of Baraboo has about 7,000 public trees, and has been designated a Tree City since 1992. Mike will explain what it takes to maintain Baraboo's urban forest, what city residents can do to promote the health of trees in the city, how residents can request trees for their tree banks, and how Baraboo's trees can help mitigate the effects of climate change by removing carbon from the atmosphere and storing it in the soil.

This program is co-sponsored by the Carnegie-Schadde Memorial Public Library of Baraboo, the City of Baraboo Parks, Recreation, and Forestry Department and Powered Up Baraboo.
