Library Construction Update

On Friday, November 18, the library staff was able to see inside our new building addition! Library staff received a tour from Carter Arndt, an architect on the project from MSA, as part of our Staff Development Day.



The library staff posed for a group photo (left) inside the new addition's front entrance on the ground floor. The structure of the room behind the group is what will be the offices for circulation staff.

In this photo (right) you can see the open area on the ground floor next to where the new circulation desk will be. To the right in the photo is the staircase leading to the old building, which will house the adult collection both upstairs and downstairs. To the left is the circulation area. Straight ahead you can see the elevator shaft and the front door. This area will have a high ceiling with the second floor program room overlooking the space.





In this photo (left), we have the new auditorium on the ground floor of the new addition. This space will be able to fit around 130 people. It will have a piano and attached kitchenette, and will be available for community use.

This photo (right) shows the area on the second floor that will be the new children's space. Much of the area will be filled with bookshelves, and there will also be tables, chairs, an educational play area, and study rooms. The areas to the right (the front of the building) will be big windows, filling the space with natural light.
